

English I

English I is a required, year-long course for ninth graders. English I is composed of vocabulary, formal and informal writing assignments, the study of literature, a review of grammar, reading, and research. Selections will include the novel To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee, the play Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare, and the epic poem The Odyssey by Homer as well as short stories, poetry, informational text, and other resources. Students will read both in and outside of class. This class often requires regular Internet access, including occasional printing. Please make arrangements in advance to meet this requirement. Please inform the teacher in advance if there is an issue.



Phone Policy

Electronic devices such as cell phones are only allowed in my class for educational purposes because they cause too many distractions. Teacher permission must be given before their usage. A sign will be posted if phones are to be used. Students are directed to store their phones in the phone locker immediately upon entering the classroom. They may remove the phone once my pack-up alarm rings. A phone that is not stored properly such as in a lap or on a desk is considered a violation of class rules. The infraction will result in a referral to the dean's office. Students will not get a warning.

Remind

All students are encouraged to use REMIND. It is a major way I communicate about the agenda and announcements. Note: It is a courtesy from your teacher and never an excuse for missing work!

Grades

100-50 Tests, essays & major projects

40-30 Quizzes & written responses

20-10 Homework & Classwork

Grading will be done on a point system.

Major assignments such as tests, essays, and projects, as well as some quizzes, count as 60% of the grade. Minor assignments such as classwork and homework count as 40% of the grade. The 9-week average will be a percentage of the total possible points.

Students and parents are encouraged to check Gradeline regularly.

Note: a "Z" is a placeholder which means work can be made up or is missing. A "O" means an assignment was not done or no credit was given.

LATE WORK

ALL assignments must be completed and turned in on time or risk penalties. Major projects and essays will lose one letter grade per day past the assigned deadline. Homework assignments are due at the beginning of class. If the homework is not turned in to the class basket on time or checked by the teacher, the grade will be entered as a zero. In other words, do not expect to finish it in class! Printer and Internet issues are not an excuse for late work. Sports and other obligations do not excuse you from assignments and deadlines. Exceptions can only be made if I'm contacted by email or through REMIND and agree to an extension.

PLAGIARISM & CHEATING



Plagiarism is the taking ideas and writings of another and passing them off as one's own

Plagiarism includes...

- turning in another's work as one's own
- copying work from a friend
- including a source but failing to cite it
- copying an author's exact words and passing them off as one's own.

Students caught plagiarizing or cheating will be given a ZERO for the assignment and may face a dean's office referral

ABSENTEE POLICY

It is the student's responsibility to find out what work was missed during an absence. There is a shelf with copies of each week's handouts in the classroom. All make-up work from an excused absence is due on the 3rd day back to school. An essay assigned before an absence is due the day the student returns. Posted tests or quizzes announced before the absence must be made up the 1st day back to school. Students cannot make up assignments, tests, or quizzes missed during an unexcused absence.

Tardy Policy

Don't be late! 1st offense for every 9 weeks: class warning. Students signs tardy log as they enter class. 2nd offense: Teacher note to dean's office. 3rd offense: referral to dean's office.

Expectations

Students are expected to follow the guidelines and procedures of the class. We will set group norms and review all rules in detail. A student may be asked to sign a discipline log to document minor infractions that tend to grow into bigger problems. Repeated infractions will result in consequences such as lost classroom privileges, parent emails or calls, and a dean's referral.

TYPICAL INFACTIONS TO AVOID:

Defiance, disrupting lessons, excessive talking, eating, sleeping, destroying school property, throwing trash
